The purpose of this circular is to give you notice of the forthcoming annual general meeting (the “**Annual General Meeting**” or “**AGM**”) of Mainland Headwear Holdings Limited (the “**Company**”) to be held at Strategic Financial Relations Limited, 24/F, Admiralty Centre 1, 18 Harcourt Road, Hong Kong on 25 May 2023 at 11:00 a.m., and information on the matters to be dealt with at the AGM. They are: (i) re-election of directors; and (ii) general mandates to issue shares and repurchase shares.

RE-ELECTION OF DIRECTORS

The board (the “**Board**”) of the directors of the Company (the “**Directors**”) currently consists of eight Directors, namely Mr. Ngan Hei Keung, the Chairman, Madam Ngan Po Ling, Pauline, *BBS, JP*, the Deputy Chairman and Managing Director, Mr. James S. Patterson, Mr. Ngan Siu Hon, Alexander, Mr. Lai Man Sing, the Chief Financial Officer, Mr. Leung Shu Yin, William, Mr. Liu Tieh Ching, Brandon, *JP* and Mr. Gordon Ng.

Pursuant to the bye-law (“**Bye-Law**”) No. 84, at each annual general meeting, one-third of the Directors for the time being (or, if their number is not a multiple of three (3), the number nearest to but not less than one-third) shall retire from office by rotation, provided that every Director shall be subject to retirement by rotation at least once every three years. A retiring Director shall be eligible for re-election and shall continue to act as a Director throughout the meeting at which he retires. The Directors to retire by rotation shall include (so far as necessary to ascertain the number of Directors to retire by rotation) any Director who wishes to retire and not to offer himself for re-election. Any further Directors so to retire shall be those of the other Directors subject to retirement by rotation who have been longest in office since their last re-election or appointment and so that as between persons who became or were last re-elected Directors on the same day those to retire shall (unless they otherwise agree among themselves) be determined by lot.

Pursuant to Bye-Law No. 86(2), the Directors shall have the power from time to time and at anytime to appoint any person as a Director either to fill a casual vacancy or, subject to authorisation by the Company’s shareholders in general meetings, as an addition to the Board. Any Director so appointed by the Board shall hold office until the first annual general meeting of the Company after his appointment and shall then be eligible for re-election at that meeting.

Pursuant to Bye-Law No. 84, Madam Ngan Po Ling, Pauline, *BBS, JP*, Mr. Liu Tieh Ching, Brandon, *JP* and Mr. Gordon Ng shall retire at the AGM. All the retiring Directors are eligible for re-election at the AGM. Accordingly, Madam, Ngan Po Ling, Pauline, *BBS, JP*, Mr. Liu Tieh Ching, Brandon, *JP* and Mr. Gordon Ng will retire by rotation as Directors at the AGM and offer himself/herself for re-election at the AGM. After reviewing the composition of the Board, the board diversity policy of the Company (the “**Board Diversity Policy**”) and the eligibility of the relevant Directors for nomination and re-election at the AGM, the Nomination Committee of the Company made recommendations to the Board on the re-election of the above Directors by the shareholders of the Company at the AGM.

According to Appendix 14 to the Rules Governing the Listing of Securities on The Stock Exchange of Hong Kong Limited (the “**Listing Rules**”), it is recommended that serving more than nine years could be relevant to the determination of a non-executive director’s independence. If an independent non-executive director serves more than nine years, any further appointment of such independent non-executive director should be subject to a separate resolution to be approved by Shareholders.

The recommendations on re-election were made in accordance with the policy on selection and nomination of Directors as incorporated into the Board Diversity Policy. In selecting and recommending candidates for directorship, the Nomination Committee of the Company took into account a wide variety of factors, including but not limited to gender, age, cultural and educational background, ethnicity, professional experience, skills, knowledge, length of service and any other factors that it may consider relevant and applicable from time to time. In relation to the re-election of independent non-executive Directors, the Nomination Committee also took into consideration the perspectives, skills and experience that Mr. Liu Tieh Ching, Brandon, *JP* and Mr. Gordon Ng could bring to the Board as independent non-executive Director, including without limitation, Mr. Liu's experience in the commercial and business fields as well as Mr. Ng's experience in the legal field. The Nomination Committee was satisfied with the independence of Mr. Liu and Mr. Ng on the basis of, among others, the independence guideline set out in Rule 3.13 of the Listing Rules, and considered them to be suitable candidates for the position of independent non-executive Director and should be re-elected.

The brief biographical details of the retiring Directors eligible for re-appointment at the AGM are set out in Appendix I.

GENERAL MANDATES TO ISSUE SHARES AND TO REPURCHASE SHARES

By ordinary resolutions passed at the annual general meeting of the Company on 26 May 2022, the Directors of the Company were granted a general mandate to allot, issue and deal with the Shares and a general mandate to repurchase the Shares on the Stock Exchange. These general mandates will lapse upon the conclusion of the forthcoming Annual General Meeting of the Company to be held on 25 May 2023, unless renewed at that meeting. These general mandates will continue in force during the period from the passing of the resolutions at the Annual General Meeting until (i) the conclusion of the next annual general meeting of the Company; (ii) the expiration of the period within which the next annual general meeting of the Company is required by law to be held ; or (iii) until these general mandates are revoked or varied by ordinary resolutions of the Shareholders in general meeting, whichever is the earlier. At the Annual General Meeting, resolutions (among others) will be proposed:

- (a) to grant an issuance mandate to the Directors to exercise the powers of the Company to allot, issue and otherwise deal with additional Shares up to a maximum of 20 per cent. of the total number of Shares in issue as at the date of passing of such resolution (the “**Issuance Mandate**”);
- (b) to grant a repurchase mandate to the Directors to enable them to repurchase the Shares on the Stock Exchange up to a maximum of 10 per cent. of the total number of Shares in issue as at the date of passing of such resolution (the “**Repurchase Mandate**”); and
- (c) to increase the number of Shares to be issued and allotted under the Issuance Mandate by an additional number representing such number of Shares repurchased under the Repurchase Mandate.

As at 12 April 2023, being the latest practicable date prior to the printing of this circular (the “**Latest Practicable Date**”), the issued share capital of the Company comprised 427,051,448 Shares. On the basis that no Shares are issued or repurchased by the Company prior to the Annual General Meeting, the Company will be allowed to issue a maximum of 85,410,289 Shares under the Issuance Mandate and to repurchase a maximum of 42,705,144 Shares under the Repurchase Mandate, representing 20 per cent. and 10 per cent. of the number of Shares in issue respectively as at the date of passing of such resolutions.

Under the Listing Rules, the Company is required to give to its shareholders all information which is reasonably necessary to enable the shareholders to make an informed decision as to whether to vote for or against the resolution to renew the grant to the Directors of the Repurchase Mandate. The explanatory statement required by the Listing Rules is set out in Appendix II.

The Directors have no immediate plans to issue any new Shares other than Shares which may fall to be issued under the share option schemes of the Company or any scrip dividend scheme which may be approved by the Shareholders.

ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

The notice of the AGM is set out on pages 14 to 18 and a form of proxy for use at the AGM is enclosed.

Whether or not you intend to attend the Annual General Meeting, you are requested to complete and return the accompanying form of proxy in accordance with the instructions printed thereon not less than 48 hours (i.e. 11:00 a.m. on Tuesday, 23 May 2023) before the time appointed for holding the Annual General Meeting. Completion and delivery of the form of proxy will not preclude you from attending and voting in person at the Annual General Meeting if you so wish.

Under the Listing Rules, all the resolutions at the AGM will be decided by poll.

RECOMMENDATIONS

The Directors consider that the proposed re-election of Directors, the proposed granting of the Repurchase Mandate and of the Issuance Mandate are in the interests of the Company and its shareholders.

The Repurchase Mandate may, depending on market conditions and funding arrangements at the time, lead to an enhancement of the Company’s net assets and/or earnings per Share and will only be made when the Directors believe that a repurchase of Shares will benefit the Company and its shareholders.

An exercise of the Repurchase Mandate in full could have a material adverse impact on the working capital and gearing position of the Company compared with that as at 31 December 2022, being the date of its last audited accounts. The Directors do not, however, intend to make any repurchase in circumstances that would have a material adverse impact on the working capital or gearing position of the Company.

The Directors believe that an exercise of the general mandate to allot and issue new Shares will enable the Company to take advantage of market conditions to raise additional capital for the Company.

Accordingly, the Directors recommend shareholders to vote in favour of the relevant resolutions to be proposed at the Annual General Meeting.

Madam Ngan Po Ling, Pauline, BBS, JP*Executive Director, Deputy Chairman and Managing Director*

Madam Ngan, aged 63, is the Deputy Chairman and Managing Director of the Company and co-founder of the Group. She has over 30 years of experience in the headwear industry and is responsible for the marketing activities of the Manufacturing Business. She is the member of the National Committee of CPPCC, the ex-officio member and ex-officio executive committee of Heung Yee Kuk New Territories, the standing committee member of the Chinese General Chamber of Commerce, member of Advisory Board of Po Leung Kuk, the president honoris causa of Hong Kong Young Industrialists Council, the honorary president and standing director of Hong Kong Federation of Overseas Chinese Association, the committee member of All- China Women's Federation, the standing committee member of All-China Federation of Returned Overseas Chinese, and the vice chairman of Hubei Province Federation of Returned Overseas Chinese. Madam Ngan was the Hong Kong Deputy to the 12th and 13th National People's Congress, People's Republic of China, awarded the Bronze Bauhinia Star in the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region in 2009 and JP (Justice of the Peace) title in 2013.

Madam Ngan did not hold any directorships in other listed companies in Hong Kong and overseas in the last three years.

Madam Ngan is the spouse of Mr. Ngan Hei Keung who is an executive Director and the controlling shareholder of the Company. Madam Ngan is the mother of Mr. Andrew Ngan, who is senior management of the Group. Madam Ngan is also the mother of Mr. Ngan Siu Hon, Alexander, who is an executive Director. Save as disclosed above, Madam Ngan does not have any relationship with any Directors, senior management or substantial or controlling shareholders of the Company.

Madam Ngan has entered into a service contract with the Company for an initial term of 3 years, which may be terminated by six months notice in writing served by either party. According to the service contract, Madam Ngan is entitled to a basic remuneration and housing allowance of HK\$270,000 per month and a discretionary year-end bonus, which is determined by reference to her duties, responsibilities and performance. Madam Ngan received HK\$5,000,000 discretionary bonus for the year ended 31 December 2022. In addition, the Company signed a lease agreement with Madam Ngan and Mr. Ngan Hei Keung at monthly rent of HK\$16,800 from 1 April 2022 to 31 March 2025.

Mr. Liu, aged 77, was appointed as an Independent Non-executive Director of the Company in August 2006. Mr. Liu is a merchant. He is an Advisory Member of the Business Forum of China National Committee for Pacific Economic Corporation of Pacific Economic Cooperation Council, the Honorary President of The Hong Kong Commerce and Industry Associations, and vice chairman of The Chinese General Chamber of Commerce.

Mr. Liu did not hold any directorships in other listed companies in Hong Kong and overseas in the last three years.

Mr. Liu does not have any relationship with any other Director, senior management or substantial shareholder of the Company.

Mr. Liu has entered into a service contract with the Company, which may be terminated by three months' notice in writing served by either party. According to the service contract, Mr. Liu is entitled to a basic remuneration of HK\$15,000 per month, which is determined by reference to his background, experience, duties and responsibilities with the Company and the prevailing market conditions. Mr. Liu did not receive any discretionary bonus for the year ended 31 December 2022.

Mr. Liu does not have interests in the securities of the Company within the meaning of Part XV of the Securities and Futures Ordinance (Chapter 571 of the Laws of Hong Kong) (the "SFO").

Mr. Liu has been appointed as an independent non-executive Director for sixteen years. Throughout his tenure, Mr. Liu has devoted sufficient time and demonstrated the required attributes of an independent non-executive Director by providing independent views and advice to the Company from the commercial and business perspectives. In the past years, Mr. Liu has (i) served as the chairman of the Company's nomination committee which is primarily responsible for recommending candidates for directorships, reviewing the Board Diversity Policy and implementing the nomination procedures of Directors; (ii) served as a member of the Company's audit committee and reviewed the financial reporting system and internal control procedures; (iii) served as a member of the Company's remuneration committee and participated in the formulation and review of the specific remuneration packages of all executive Directors and senior executives of the Group; (iv) reviewed the connected transactions and continuing connected transactions of the Group; and (v) attended annual general meetings to answer questions of the shareholders.

In addition, the Board believes that Mr. Liu's continued tenure brings considerable stability to the Board and the Board has benefited greatly from the contribution of Mr. Liu in relation to his extensive experience in the commercial and business fields.

Independent non-executive Director

Mr. Ng, aged 58, obtained his Bachelor's degree in Microbiology and Biochemistry and Master's degree in Intellectual Property from University of London. He has been the Head of Corporate Finance/Capital Market, Asia of the Hong Kong Office of an international law firm since July 2013. Prior to that, he had been a partner of a number of international law firms.

Mr. Ng is presently an independent non-executive director of China Energine International (Holdings) Limited and ZTE Corporation which are listed on the main board of the Stock Exchange of Hong Kong Limited.

Mr. Ng does not have any relationship with any other Director, senior management or substantial shareholder of the Company.

Mr. Ng has entered into a service contract with the Company for an initial term of one year, renewable automatically for successive terms of one year. The service contract may be terminated by three months' notice in writing served by either party. Mr. Ng is entitled to a director's fee of HK\$15,000 per month, which is determined by reference to his background, experience, duties and responsibilities with the Company and the prevailing market conditions. Mr. Ng did not receive any discretionary bonus for the year ended 31 December 2022.

Mr. Ng does not have interests in the securities of the Company within the meaning of Part XV of the SFO.

There is no other matters that need to be brought to the attention of the shareholders of the Company in accordance with Rule 13.51(2)(w) of the Listing Rules. In addition, there is no other information to be disclosed pursuant to any of the requirements of the provisions under Rule 13.51(2)(h) to (v) of the Listing Rules.

The Listing Rules permit companies whose primary listings are on the Stock Exchange to repurchase their own securities on the Stock Exchange subject to certain restrictions.

2. REASONS FOR REPURCHASE

The Directors believe that a grant of the Repurchase Mandate is in the best interests of the Company and its shareholders. An exercise of the Repurchase Mandate may, depending on market conditions and funding arrangements at the time, lead to an enhancement of the net assets per share and/or earnings per share of the Company and will only be made when the Directors believe that a repurchase will benefit the Company and its shareholders.

3. FUNDING OF REPURCHASES

Pursuant to the Repurchase Mandate, repurchase would be funded entirely from the Company's available cash flow or working capital facilities which will be funds legally available under Bermuda law for the purpose.
